





#### **Directions to the Museum**

#### From San Francisco

Take Bay Bridge (I-80) east to I-580, then connect to Hwy. 24 heading east toward Walnut Creek. At the Walnut Creek interchange, take I-680 south to Crow Canyon Road exit. Go east (left) on Crow Canyon Road 4.2 miles. Turn right on Camino Tassajara. The first left (at the Movies 7 Theater) is the entrance to Blackhawk Plaza. The second right takes you into the closest parking area. The Museum is on the hill above the gated Plaza entrance.

### From Oakland Airport

Take I-880 south toward San Jose. Just past San Leandro, at Hayward, take Hwy. 238 to connect to I-580 east. Take I-680 north (toward Walnut Creek) at the Dublin/Pleasanton interchange to Crow Canyon Road exit. Go east (right) on Crow Canyon Road 4.2 miles. Turn right on Camino Tassajara. The first left (at the Movies 7 Theater) is the entrance to Blackhawk Plaza. The second right takes you into the closest parking area. The Museum is on the hill above the gated Plaza entrance.

#### From San Jose

Take I-680 north to Crow Canyon Road exit. Go east (right) on Crow Canyon Road 4.2 miles. Turn right on Camino Tassajara. The first left (at the Movies 7 Theater) is the entrance to Blackhawk Plaza. The second right takes you into the closest parking area. The Museum is on the hill above the gated Plaza entrance.

## From the Central Valley (Modesto, Stockton, Tracy) or Livermore

Take I-580 west to I-680 north (right) to Crow Canyon Road exit. Go east (right) on Crow Canyon Road 4.2 miles. Turn right on Camino Tassajara. The first left (at the Movies 7 Theater) is the entrance to Blackhawk Plaza. The second right takes you into the closest parking area. The Museum is on the hill above the gated Plaza entrance.
