BITS AND PIECES



Larry Zurbrick got one of Dwight's Gem 1 materials kits and has been making some progress. He brought in the machined frame with a nice crankshaft turned from bar stock. Larry mentioned his turning skills evolved through three attempts.



Mike Rehmus is continuing to evolve his additive manufacturing product line of model engine distributors. He has versions suitable for 2, 4, 6, and 8 cylinder engines. This month he had an operating prototype showing rotor function and a printed fixture for machining commercially procured distributors.



Mike Byrne discussed learning to produce scalable parametric models in Solidworks. Examples were a Turner's Cube with recursively smaller bores and a spur gear program that will produce correct involute geometry for specified number of teeth, diametrical pitch, pressure angle, and whole depth ratio. He showed 3-D printed "proof of concept" examples.



Dwight also had turbine stage he scrounged from a Mare Island dumpster 40 years ago. He had it mounted and could spin it up using compressed air.

Next meeting will be at GGLS. GGLS will be having their spring show event the same weekend.
